Elections for the Parish Council will be held on May 4th this year, as customary on the four year cycle—there will be several vacancies as a result of retirements, so please consider whether you or someone you know would be prepared to work for the good of our parish and its residents. We do have an immediate vacancy so this

The City Council's Electoral Services Office are currently reviewing the date subsequent elections should be held, in 2028, 2027 or 2024, which all have consequences for the costs we will need to meet from the parish precept.

To vote in person, at any election from May 4th onwards you will need photo ID; if you don't have a driving licence, passport or bus pass (out of date is fine!), you can apply for a Voter Authority Certificate. This is FREE of charge but the deadline to apply is 5.00pm on 25th April 2023:

Crossing on Woodgreen Drive

Parish Councillors have long campaigned for a pedestrian crossing where the bridleway from Newtown Road links to the cycle and pedestrian route to Tesco and the Lyppard Hub. This is now scheduled as part of an Active Travel corridor from the Lyppard Ponds to the Country Park and hopefully will be installed ready for the autumn term.

Neighbourhood Plan Update:

As mentioned in the last Parish Newsletter, we are working to ensure that our Neighbourhood Plan stays in step with the Review of the South Worcestershire Development Plan - "SWDPR". The next milestone in that process will be the publication of the results of the recent SWDPR Consultation exercise - in the next few months followed by the consideration of the SWDPR proposals by the Planning Inspectorate. Once the outcome of that inspection is known, the Neighbourhood Plan can be finalised and made ready for a referendum of residents of the parish. It's been a long process, but, as mentioned previously, the work completed so far has already ready provided a number of positive benefits to the parish!

2022 was a busy year for the group carrying out a whole range of activities to enhance the environment and it looks like 2023 will be even busier with the launch of the **Wild About Worcester Way**, a 12 mile footpath and wildlife corridor around Worcester. In December volunteers alongside staff from Worcester City Council planted 20 cherry trees in Racefield Meadow, as part of the city's commitment to

increasing biodiversity. As well as benefits to wildlife, it will enhance the area for future generations of residents. WEG Volunteers donated 2820 hours of their time last year, which I think you will agree is pretty amazing!
